



7 THINGS TO KNOW



This past November there was a gathering of LGBTQ+ Presbyterians at the national offices in Louisville, KY. During that gathering information from a survey of largely queer Presbyterians was disseminated for discussion. This survey was meant, in part, to help the church better know the experience queer people have had and the hopes carried for who the church can be. The survey information was summed up in seven things queer people want the church to know.

- **Inclusion is more than acceptance; it's belonging**
 - Belonging is at the core of the Christian faith. We confess that in life and in death we belong to our faithful Savior, Jesus Christ, and through him to one another, the Church, the Body of Christ.
- **Our safety depends on your courage**
 - Too often LGBTQ+ folks have experienced a lack of safety in church and society. For queer folks to feel safe it takes the courage of everyone to stand up for us. In this case silence is not safe.

- **We long for connection and community across regions and generations**
 - As with all people, queer people long for connection with the wider whole of the church.
- **Policy is not the same as practice**
 - Policies are important for the ways they provide structure and accountability in an institution or community, but a policy is only as good as the practices of individuals and groups that have them. A pride flag is only a sign of affirmation if people's behavior matches it.
- **Queer leadership is already here; support and amplify it**
 - There are queer leaders in our congregation and presbytery, how we support their voices matter.
- **A faithful church speaks aloud**
 - "This little light of mine, I'm gonna let it shine." Christianity is not a faith of silence but proclamation. We are called to use our voices to share our faith and to advocate for our neighbors who are marginalized or in need.
- **Joy, resilience and faith are thriving; nurture them**
 - Queer people, especially queer Christians are full of joy and faith, despite so much fear and exclusion. How we nurture faith and joy matters, that we nurture them at all matters.

Each of these points speaks to deep realities in the life of the church and in the life of queer people. They encourage and challenge the church to be a community that cares for the whole person and not just surface level appearances.

As a queer person I believe these seven points are applicable not only in regards to LGBTQ+ people in the church, but everyone. How are these seven points inviting you to better affirm and celebrate LGBTQ+ people in the church? How do you see these seven points teaching you about how to better affirm and celebrate all people in the church, regardless of the beautiful differences we hold? These seven things help point us towards a way of being church where people can experience the abundant life Jesus offers.

I came so that they could have life—indeed, so that they could live life to the fullest.— John 10:10b (CEB)

Project Regeneration begins on February 10

The Session agreed to begin the Presbyterian Foundation's Project Regeneration program on February 10. The initial meeting will involve the Session and Deacons along with Pastor Entz and Church Treasurer Mandy Harkess. The facilitator for the program is Pastor Kyle Nolan, the foundation's Upper Midwest Ministry Relations officer.

During the first several weeks of the program the group will be reading a book, probably *The Sailboat Church* by Joan Gray. The foundation will also receive the church's financial information over the past several years and the demographics of the congregation. Also included will be information gathered last summer when we worked with Pastor Anna Kendig Flores during Entz' sabbatical. The data and the book will be the focus of a discussion among the group this spring. The Session is planning a Coffee, Classes and Conversation update on the process in early March

Budget increase presented at annual meeting

With the resignation of Church Administrative Assistant Christy Wood in January, the Session approved a pay increase for a new hire filling that job. The congregation was informed at the annual meeting that it could have up to an \$8,000 impact on this year's budget. The actual budget increase will depend on the new hire's experience and background, and how soon the person starts in the position. Kathy Quady is volunteering to cover the job in the interim.
