


RIVERS OF HOPE – This is one of our Mission Recipients. We received a "thank you letter" for the \$1000 which we gave to them. They "provide a community-coordinated response to end family violence. In 2022 they provided free advocacy services to 750 adults and 184 youth all experiencing some form of domestic violence. This is a 33% increase from 2021. Rivers of Hope is available to support victims/survivors of domestic violence 24 hours a day, 7 days a week." They thanked us for our support, indicating they cannot do the work alone and appreciate our generosity and support.

# **Session Summary**

Highlights of the March 19 Special Congregational Meeting and the March 21 Stated Meeting

# Congregation elects at-large members to the Nominating Committee

At a special congregational meeting on March 19 the congregation elected Virginia Johnson, Julie Long, and Larry Pattee as the at-large members to the Nominating Committee. Along with an Elder and a Deacon, they will seek nominees for two open Elder positions on the Session and two Deacon openings on the Board of Deacons. They will be doing their work in the coming weeks and propose their nominees to the congregation in late April/early May.

# Session defines the duties of the Accessibility Coordination Team

The Session set the parameters for the work of the Accessibility Coordination Team. The team will make recommendations to the Session on improving accessibility to the church's facilities and programs based on the accessibility audit which was completed in 2022. The Session kept the guidelines broad stating, "Using the Accessibility Audit, its results, and its feedback as your launching point, Session Charges the ACT (Accessibility Coordination Team) to coordinate the efforts to address and increase the accessibility of Buffalo Presbyterian Church, it's ministries, programs, and facilities. The ACT is to report to Session and seek Session's approval for any policy changes or financial expenditures outside of the general budget."

### Gideons will promote their ministry in June

The Session discussed a request from the local Gideons chapter to share their story and solicit funds for their work at a Sunday worship. The Session members agreed that the Gideons could make a presentation at a CCC time after worship in the summer.
