gion consider Jesus to be a wise teacher, a prophet, and even God's Messiah, but Christians alone acknowledge him as uniquely and fully God and fully human, the only Savior. It is our faith in Jesus that grounds us in our religion and makes us distinct from those of other religions and no religion.

By answering this question in the affirmative we acknowledge our call to take on the faith of Jesus. This faith acknowledges and worships one God and loves God with the whole of one's heart, strength, soul, and mind. This faith loves neighbors as one's self, this faith puts love as the highest value and virtue in life.

Our life as Christians is very much a life built on faith, both faith IN and faith OF Jesus.

May God renew our faith, through the grace of the Holy Spirit.

## Immigration Aid Collaboration

BPC has undertaken a new collaboration with Wright County Immigrant Aid. WCI Immigrant Aid is a unique collaboration of community members that came together in 2025 to create WCI Immigrant Aid with the mission of helping new Americans struggling to meet their basic needs. In all cases they help those in need to seek help first from existing social services, then fill the gap they are unable to meet. This collaboration, on the part of BPC, fits with the work we are already doing in partnership with the Buffalo Food Shelf, Love INC, and others. Because of our membership in the Presbytery of the Twin Cities Area the Mission Committee was able to secure a \$10,000 grant to help WCI Immigrant Aid in caring for the basic needs of our immigrant neighbors.

We look forward to hearing more about the work of WCI Immigrant Aid and the ways we can partner with them to support our immigrant neighbors in a CCC presentation on Nov. 9th.


## Peace & Global Witness Special Offering

## Session Summary

Highlights of the September 16th Stated Session Meeting

#### Session Reviews 2026 Preliminary Budget

The Session discussed the preliminary budget for the coming year. The budget lists expenditures of 206,000. The budget represents a two percent increase over the current year's budget. Elders reviewed individual committee budgets in August and September, and submitted them to Treasurer Mandy Harkess. The budget will be the topic of the October 5 Coffee, Classes, and Conversation following worship. Congregants will see the breakdown of expenses planned for the coming year. Members will have another chance to comment on the budget at a special congregational meeting in December.

#### Please Pay Your Per Capita (if you haven't)

In the budget discussion, Treasurer Harkess reported that per capita giving is lagging behind what was pledged for this year. Per capita is a \$40/member assessment that supports the presbytery, synod, and General Assembly's programs. The Session has committed to paying our full amount based on our 90 person membership. Any of the \$3600 total annual per capita not paid by members will come from the general budget. If you haven't paid your per capita please do so as soon as possible. Please note on your payment that it is specifically for "per capita." Thank you!
