The Gift of the New Year



The new year starts, whether we are ready for it or not. With it's beginning comes for many the making of resolutions, the taking on of a word for the year, or some new/renewed habit or practice. For some people it is just another trip around the sun and there are no new habits, words, or resolutions.

The New Year celebration falls in the midst of the 12 day season of Christmas, a season (for many)

filled with gatherings, lots of cookies, and gifts given and received. Most importantly Christmas is the celebration of God's greatest gift to the world, God's very self in the baby Jesus. The season of Christmas ends with Epiphany, on January 6th, when we remember the visitation of the Magi to the Christ child and his parents.

On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. -Matthew 2:11

These wise men bring with them gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, but also themselves in worship. Before they present the items they bring they give themselves, bowing low in worship of this baby, who's birth was foretold by a star in the heavens. This gift of worship, of their own presence and attention, is the greatest gift they gave, even though it is the least spoken of and the least remembered.

As we begin the new year we have the chance not just to better our health, change our spending, or adopt new habits, but also the opportunity to renew our faith and spiritual life, to give ourselves anew to God as the magi gave themselves in worship. This new year I invite you to take time and ask yourself what gift might you offer Christ? How might you rededicate (or dedicate for the first time) yourself to God? While specific acts of service and gifts of money or possessions are important and valued in the Christian life the most important thing we can offer God is our very self. Our love (of God and neighbor), our attention, and our worship are the most prized gifts we can give to God.

Perhaps you are aware of something that has been taking your time and attention away from God, could that time be the thing you offer back? Maybe you have been feeling called to a new or renewed form of mission and ministry in the church, could answering that call be what you give to God this year? Has your prayer and devotional life been put on the back burner or abandoned all together, maybe picking that practice up once more can be your gift? Only you and God know the gift you could give and only you can give it.

Regardless of what new habits and resolutions you might make this year, I invite you to consider what you might give God in 2024.

Therefore, I urge you, siblings, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. -Romans 12:1

PARENTING WITH GRACE

Parenting with Grace donations of \$220 were given from our Mission Committee funds and the Peacemaking offering. (bringing Parenting with Grace donation total from this and crafty ladies to \$1,2220 for the year)

Buffalo Presbyterian Church Celebrates 148th Birthday

On Sunday, December 10, Buffalo Presbyterian Church celebrated its 148th birthday. The church was founded in 1875 and a building was constructed on the corner of 1st Street and First Avenue in 1877 (current farmers' market site) making it the oldest church in the city of Buffalo. The week before members put together 161 hygiene kits (photo above) to send to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). PDA will distribute the kits—tooth brushes, bars of soap, washcloths, hand towels, bandages, nail clippers, and combs—to victims of natural disasters and human violence around the world.

Session Summary

Highlights of the December Meeting

Session is thankful for members' generosity

Treasurer Mandy Harkess reported that pledges were above last year's pledges during the same time frame. Although several pledges haven't been received, she noted that giving levels among our members have increased and that members were honoring the pledges they made for 2023. Session members noted the continuing generosity of our members and friends, not only with their financial contributions but with their time and talents as well. They look forward to showing their appreciation in 2024 for all that our worshiping community has done in 2023.

Members will discuss church land use at the annual meeting

In addition to discussing routine business at the annual meeting on January 28, the congregation will discuss whether there is any interest in selling a portion of the church property (southwest edge). This idea was first brought to Session by members of the congregation. If there is interest in a land sale, the Session would begin exploring possible uses for the property and bring alternatives back to the congregation. The discussion at the annual meeting will focus on the area of property that might be sold and what the procedure would be if the congregation chooses to explore a sale.

Mary Markve-Patch will serve as Ashton Olson's CPM Liaison

The Session appointed Mary Markve-Patch as the Session liaison to support Ashton Olsen as they explore ordination with the presbytery's Committee on Preparation for the Ministry (CPM). Markve-Patch will attend meetings with Olsen and keep the Session informed about their progress. The Session is exploring, with CPM, adding an additional liaison to provide more support.

Girl Scouts troop will be meeting at BPC

Pastor Brian Entz provided some details to the Session about the Girl Scouts group that will be using the church. The girls, younger elementary-age kids, and their leaders will be meeting on the first and third Mondays each month. They are looking forward to doing service projects with, and for, the church. If you have any ideas for a project they might do, contact an Elder, Brian, or Christy.
